What is JACoW?

- International collaboration for the electronic publication of accelerator conference proceedings
- Website
 - Proceedings
 - Documentation
 - Tools
- Team
 - People actively working on it



Responsibilities

JACoW

- Publish proceedings at JACoW.org
- Support member conferences (tools, software, shared knowledge, volunteers)

Conferences

- Provide proceedings satisfying JACoW requirements
- Send Editors in Chief to Team Meetings
- Actively support the collaboration



Open Archive

- Tools help setup and run a conference, process papers, prepare final documents
- Library metadata for Open Access archives (Inspire)
- Creative Commons Attribution 3.0 (CC BY 3.0)
 - Use, share, adapt
 - Give credit to authors and licensor

- Mechanical Engineering and Design of Synchrotron Instruments (MEDSI) from 2015




Published conferences

 - LINAC '66-'92 (8 sets)

2014 Team Meeting in Melbourne

- Review of Regional Centres procedures and issues
- New fileserver for Americas to come
- Templates: working group to enhance
- Citations and indexing
 - Metadata for Search engines
 - Export for humans
- Publication of posters and talks



Development sustainability

- **SPMS**, OK for *short* term development
- Must pursue development of new tools
- Indico team was not present but in contact
- SPMS-Indico convergence, medium/long term project
- Planned enhancements to scripts



First 3 years of "new JACoW era"

- New charter and management model since 2012
- First 3-years mandates came to the end
- Elections
- Demand for some modifications to the charter

Modifications to the charter

- Solve some anomalies
 - All BoD members elected but the Coordinator
 - Election of "Technical" Officers
 - e.g. SPMS developer... what sense?



Charter v. 1.2

- January 2015
- Small modifications to solve previous anomalies
- Coordinator same as other Officers in the BoD
- Need to elect all the Officers is removed
- Further modifications postponed to BoD



Charter 2.0



Major issues

- Team Members
 - What's the role of non-editors?
 - Who can vote in the Team
 - Definition too loose?
- Board of Directors
 - Not only a management body
 - Number of members
 - Regional Representatives: not worked as wanted



Definition of the Team

- Nothing changes, just clearer:
 - Team = Editors + Experts (co-opted) + BoD
 - Team Meetings are open to all other conference representatives
- Voting easy
 - One vote per person only
 - One vote per conference only



Definition of the BoD

- Smaller group: 5
 - Chair, Deputy, Coordinator + 2 Directors
 - Possibility to invite up to 3 people
- No Regional Representatives (as roles)
- Regions represented by Board members instead
- All 5 elected by the Team



Importance of Projects

- Hard to track activities until now
- Create Working Groups inside the Team
- Appoint one Project/Group Leader (Officer)
 - Will be responsible for the task
 - Will report to the Board



Migration process

- Now the BoD has 8 members
- Many newly elected
- Target is getting to 5 ASAP
- Past actions still valid (elections)



Migration process/2

- Jan and Matt volunteer to leave the BoD (8 \rightarrow 6)
- John's mandate will end this year $(6 \rightarrow 5)$
- Volker will be invited for 1.5 years
- Drop of 'Regional Representative' role
- Resulting:
 - end of 2015: 6 people, no elections
 - from 2016: reintroduce rotation

Outcomes of SHM#3 (2014)

- SPMS features
 - Citations of JACoW material
 - Searchable list of (JACoW) publications per person/institute
 - new templates with auto-generated wrappers
- Still work in progress (cfr "Development sustainability")



Outcomes of SHM#3 (2014)

- New fileserver for the Americas is in use for IPAC15
- Metadata searchability
 - Push to Inspire now a boundary condition
- JACoW-Indico convergence
 - Approached heads of CERN Beams Department
 - Business case is needed
 - External funding?
 - Will follow this task after IPAC as a Project
